

ORDINANCE 2007 - 01

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING COUNCIL
OF THE BOROUGH OF CATAWISSA
TO MAKE CHANGES TO THE SEWERS AND SEWAGE DISPOSAL
ORDINANCE, CHAPTER 18 OF THE CATAWISSA BOROUGH CODE.

WHEREAS, the Council of the Borough of Catawissa deems it to be in the best interest of the health, maintenance and welfare of the residents of the Borough of Catawissa to enact certain changes to Chapter 18 of the Catawissa Borough Code.

NOW THEREFORE, IT IS ORDAINED AND ENACTED by the Council of the Borough of Catawissa, Columbia County, Pennsylvania, as follows:

CHAPTER 18 SECTION 202. This Ordinance shall make changes to Section 202 of chapter 18 and shall read as follows:

Section 202-1. Residential Establishments: \$25.00 per Month

Section 202-2. Non-Residential Establishments:

- A. Except as provided in paragraph (B) of this section (2), owners of nonresidential establishments shall pay a sewer rental equal to \$25.00 per month multiplied by the number of equivalent dwelling units indicated in the following schedule.
- B. Notwithstanding the provisions of paragraph (A) of this subsection (2), owners of major nonresidential establishments and industrial establishments shall pay sewer rental based upon the actual water consumption, with exceptions as hereinafter noted in subsection (4) computed at a rate of \$4.64 per 1,000 gallons per month, with a minimum monthly charge of \$25.00.

Section 202-5. Minimum Sewer Rentals. Notwithstanding any other provisions contained in this Part 2, all owners of property connected to the sewer system shall be required to pay a minimum sewer rental of \$25.00 per month per residential establishment and \$ 25.00 per month per equivalent dwelling unit as set forth in the schedule in subsection (2) hereof.

In all other respects not inconsistent herewith Chapter 18 of the Catawissa Borough Code shall remain unchanged.
